





What happened in 2010

Some figures

Near Makeni, at the Magbenteh Community Hospital

- 300 patients cared for monthly at Magbenteh
- 4'923 patients were provided with outpatient care at our clinic during the 3rd quarter.
- 190 operations were performed monthly during the 3rd quarter (hernia 18%, laparotomies 16%, hysterectomies and/or C-Sections 18%).



In Lungi, at the Bai Bureh Memorial Hospital

- 112 patients were admitted each month
- 1'798 patients
 received care at our
 outpatient clinic
 during the 2nd quarter
- 58 operations were performed during the 2nd quarter.



At the TFC, our therapeutic feeding centre for children under 5



- 170 children were cared for during the 3rd quarter
- 8%: mortality rate during the 3rd quarter (lower than in 2009: 13%).

Educational sponsorship program


- 183 children are in our educational sponsorship program

February 2010

Water pump repaired at primary school

Water is once again accessible at a primary school in Makeni. Thanks to a generous donor, we have been able to have the water pump repaired.



with about 600 students in total, has about 90 students per class and the need for water is large. Now, fewer children get sick as they have access to clean water at school.

March 2010

A new incinerator and water for the operating block!

An incinerator has been put into service to replace to old refuse pit that had become quite an unhealthy issue at the hospital.

A water tower with a 3'000 litre tank has been constructed close to the operating block of the hospital to facilitate access to water in this building.

June 2010

The X-ray machine has been repaired

Thanks to Theo, who was visiting the hospital, the C-arc X-ray



machine is back in use. He creatively managed to get it operational again with a work around to switch the machine on (operating the on/off switch directly on the printed circuit board with a pencil through a hole drilled into the cover casing). After more than half a year without an X-ray machine, MCH has an operational X-ray machine once again!!

SSLDF offices move to Magbenteh

The offices in Freetown have been moved to the Magbenteh Community Hospital grounds where a building has been erected to house the offices. This will eliminate the cost of renting offices in Freetown and will allow for a better management of organizational affairs (health, education, agriculture and relief).

Victor Tobler, from Switzerland, went to supervise the work from start to finish. The result is great!!



June 2010

MCH has solar power now

Thanks to the Germans Johannes, Fred, Eric and Uwe and to all



the donations they received (€150'000), we now have light in all the wards of the hospital and the TFC. This project started in September 2008, work started in March 2010 and finished in June 2010.

Emergency equipment can now run day or night on the solar power, like the oxygen concentrators. Deliveries at night are no longer dependent on a dangerous kerosene lamp and flashlights that run out of batteries, a good lamp gives light at

any time of the day as necessary now.

The use of the big generator has been considerably reduced as has the cost for fuel to run the generators.
